ACHIEVEMENTS

The Technology Equity Resource Alliance (TERA) was highly effective in fostering collaboration and communication between organizations with similar missions.

Breaking down the silos between the participating organizations unlocked opportunities that increased the impact of existing programs.

Below are a few examples:

- Kode with Klossy and All Star Code hosted an hour-long session between staff to share best practices for returning their programs in person.
- After discussing the challenges of collecting demographic data on scholars from diverse and intersectional racial and ethnic backgrounds, Major League Hacking provided best practices for collecting demographic data. Several organizations implemented these best practices, leading to a more robust, accurate understanding of the participants they serve.
- CodeDay provided TechTogether with resources to loan out laptops at the beginning of the pandemic to eliminate barriers to entry for participants from underserved communities that may not have access to computers at home.

LOOKING FORWARD

Technology Equity Resource Alliance (TERA) will continue for another year with the same members and mission with logistical changes to the meeting cadence and format.
